Michigan Public Act 72 of 2020, MCL 324.80112a, provides that if a political subdivision (local unit of government) believes a temporary ordinance is needed for the use of vessels on a water body subject to its jurisdiction, the political subdivision

The statute further provides for a temporary (6 months) Local Watercraft Control (LWC) to regulate the use of vessels and other contrivances on waters within their jurisdiction. When a local unit of government adopts a temporary LWC they may use the term ordinance.

Submitting an application and resolution does not guarantee approval of a LWC.
